Go Jump in a Lake

Lake Huron to be specific. "Life is Better at the Beach", a million folksy cottage signs declare. If it's that sign-worthy, you know it's true. Ontario's West Coast has 100 km of Lake Huron shoreline and 15 sandy beaches to dig your toes into. Spread out a blanket and soak up some rays, and let the stress melt away. Warning: excessive use may result in beach hair and pink glowing skin.

Cool off here:

Goderich offers a choice of three different beaches. The **Main Beach** is a large sandy beach featuring a boardwalk, snack bar and playground. **Rotary Cove**, a crescent shaped beach is shallow and sandy, and **St. Christopher's Beach** offers sun and shade with rocks to perch on.



The **Guelph to Goderich Rail Trail**, or G2G, is a 132 km trail along the former CPR Railway line abandoned in 1988 and now a highly accessible, public recreational trail for non-motorized use: walking, hiking, running, cycling, snowshoeing and skiing.

Road Trip: Goderich

Goderich, known as the "Canada's prettiest town", is Huron County's largest community. A busy port, it is the only deepwater port on the eastern shore of Lake Huron, welcoming 250 ships annually. In the centre of town, you'll find The Square (actually an octagon) with shopping, dining, festivals and events, and Culbert's Bakery—home of the famous cream puff.

Fun Fact:

Goderich is home to the world's largest underground salt mine. Located at the mouth of the Maitland River, it extends several kilometres under Lake Huron. The salt mine is as deep as the CN Tower is tall. The Goderich Salt Festival is celebrating everything salt from September 15 to 17.

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Road Trip: Bluewater

Get to know the three villages of Bluewater. Bayfield is a charming lakeside village that offers arts, culture and great dining options. Zurich was settled by Swiss-German immigrants and was once home to famed clock maker George Hess. Pride in their heritage is found in the village name and in the St. Peter's Lutheran Church clock tower. Hensall is the white bean capital of Canada. Thousands of tons of beans are annually processed, packaged and shipped globally in this agricultural industry hub.




Ashfield-Colborne-Wawanosh




Home of the White Squirrel!

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Road Trip: Central Huron



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Road Trip: Huron East

Experience history in Huron East. Seaforth and Brussels have beautiful commercial architecture and stately Victorian homes. The Van Egmond House, a Country Manor House built in 1846 has been carefully restored and now operates as a museum in Egmondville. During World War II, the Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) had a station in Vanastra that was used to train and supply over 7,000 radar technicians and support staff for American, British and Canadian forces.

Road Trip: North Huron



The tradition continues today with concerts by contemporary artists at the Wingham Town Hall Theatre. 

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Road Trip: Morris-Turnberry





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Road Trip: Howick




