

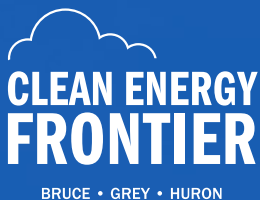


CLEAN ENERGY FRONTIER SUMMIT 2023

The annual **Clean Energy Frontier Summit**, hosted by Bruce Power, Bruce County and the Nuclear Innovation Institute, provides a platform for **two-way communication** between stakeholders and the clean energy sector.

This year's event brought together the Clean Energy Frontier Regional Steering Committee, local elected officials from Bruce, Grey, Huron and local Indigenous communities, nuclear sector supply chain representatives, education sector representatives, municipal staff, and economic development stakeholders to share strategies toward **sustainable growth**.

During the Summit, participants were asked to consider strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and actionable steps toward sustainable growth. The roundtable discussions considered housing, workforce, training, education, culture and recreation, and municipal infrastructure.

One thing is for certain: opportunity is abundant in the Clean Energy Frontier region.

It is up to everyone to be ready for growth and to leverage the opportunities presented by the clean energy sector.

We asked you how this region can **action** these opportunities, and here's what we **heard**:

TRAINING AND WORKFORCE

- Offer local programming in local facility/space
- Coordinate partners including public, private and provide local opportunities
- Train the Trainer programs
- Increase positive promotion of nuclear industry to engage and inspire participation in workforce
- Attract additional post-secondary /satellite campus to deliver programming
- When one vendor or employer trains, open opportunity to network for collaboration/sharing service for cost savings and efficiency

MUNICIPAL INFRASTRUCTURE

- Explore partnerships with private industry/investors/other municipalities
- Work collaboratively to deliver efficient service/review opportunities for shared services
- Review bylaws and best practices used across the province
- Stay up to date with industry best practices and learn from other municipalities
- Advocate for infrastructure funding, demonstrate aligned effort to support growth in our communities

HEALTHCARE

- Advocate together, as a region, for healthcare support from provincial and federal government
- Work together as a region to attract doctors, specialists, healthcare practitioners
- Grey Bruce recruitment rather than community vs community

HOUSING

- Advocate together for funding from all levels of government for housing
- Encourage municipalities to add infrastructure capacity to proactively support growth
- Review municipal process and set best practices/higher standards of service
- Streamline approvals, reduce red tape

EDUCATION

- Collaborate with industry to understand specific skill and job gaps, and work collaboratively to fill them
- Communication between industries must be collaborative to find solutions

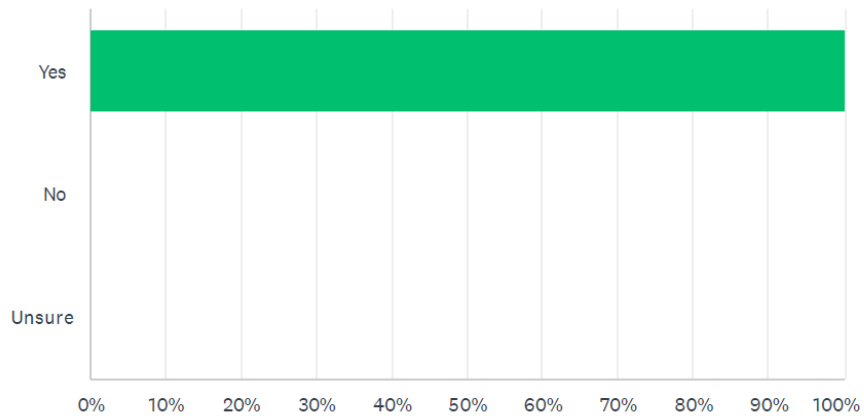

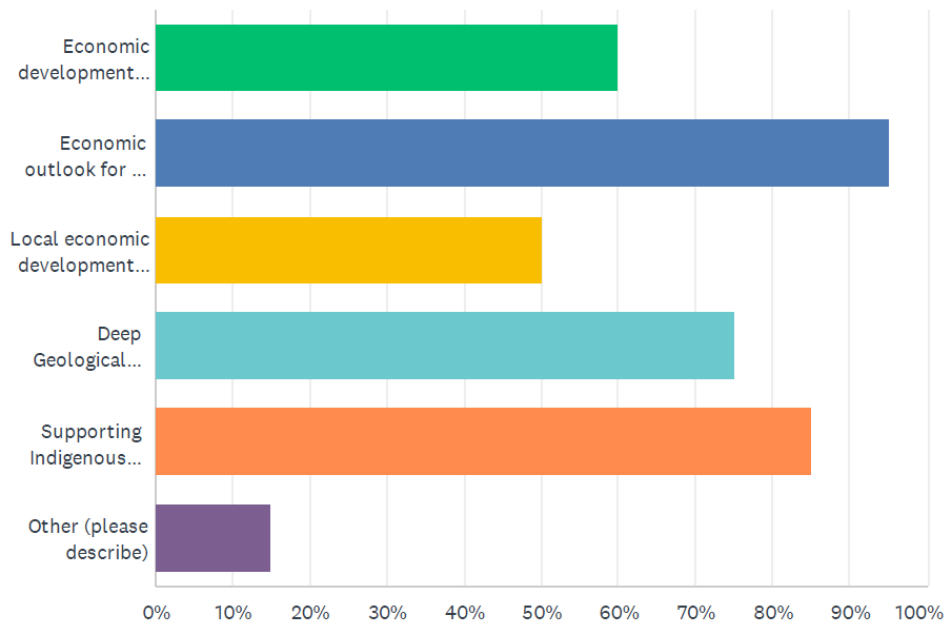

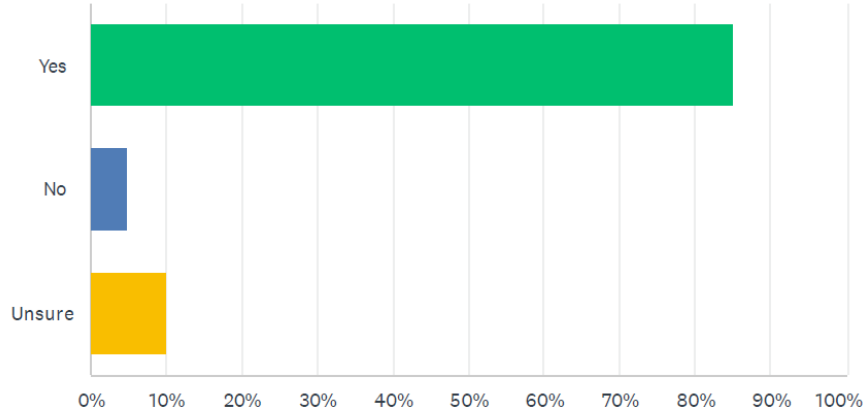
