## Town forges new partnership with Caledon Chamber of Commerce

The Town of Caledon and Caledon Chamber of Commerce have implemented a new partnership strategy, with the goal of helping local businesses succeed.

At Caledon Council's September 12 General Committee meeting, a staff report outlining the partnership strategy was brought forward by Amanda St. John, Caledon's Manager of Business Attraction and Investment.

Mayor Annette Groves said the report was "good news" and demonstrates the benefits of working collaboratively.

"This is long overdue... assisting the Chamber in supporting local businesses is great," said Groves.

Ward 5 Councillor Tony Rosa said he's pleased to see the partnership moving forward. He thanked the local business owners who make up the Chamber's volunteer Board of Directors for their effort.

"This is a step in the right direction," said Rosa, noting he's excited for the Chamber to have a space to work at the Humber River Centre in Bolton, which is opening soon.

Regional Councillor Christina Early said she wanted to thank Rosa, who she said worked very hard to re-establish a partnership between the Town and Chamber.

The Town of Caledon and Caledon Chamber of Commerce's partnership strategy will see the parties enter into a lease agreement for dedicated use of Humber River Centre office space.

For two years, as the Chamber gets established, the office space will come at a subsidized rate. The Town will help the Chamber deliver business services at the Humber River Centre.

The Caledon Chamber of Commerce re-launched in 2021 and is currently focused on offering business support services and networking opportunities to the Caledon business community.

The Chamber also undertakes advocacy efforts on behalf of the Caledon business community.

It's been several years since fire trucks came out of the downtown hall with their alarms blaring ready to battle fires in Bolton.


The station moved to a new location further north on Highway 50 in 2021.

With a renovation funded in part by a \$3.5-million investment from the Canada Infrastructure Bank, the new \$1.9-million space has a modern design and glass walls.

The town is hosting a celebration on Saturday, Feb. 10 to mark the opening.

Here's what you need to know about the grand opening and centre:



- The event kicks off at 11 a.m. with a ribbon cutting with Mayor Annette Groves and local dignitaries.
- Guided tours of the new 10,000-square-foot sustainable, accessible space will run from noon to 2 p.m.
- From 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., there will be activities and a vendor market. Caledon Public Library will have on display tools and resources available in the makerspaces.

Beyond the grand opening, the centre will offer in-person and virtual business supports and programs.

Economic development will be on-site Thursdays from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. to meet with local businesses. Book a meeting with the team: [business@caledon.ca](mailto:business@caledon.ca)

## Federal investment to enable Old Bolton Fire Hall to be converted into green community space

**Bolton, Ontario, January 24, 2023**— Today, Maninder Sidhu, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Foreign Affairs and Member of Parliament for Brampton East, and Her Worship Annette Groves, Mayor of the Town of Caledon, announced federal funding of up to \$7.7 million to revitalize the Old Bolton Fire Hall.

The fire hall will be converted to the Humber River Centre, a state-of-the-art multi-use community space that will be more sustainable and accessible. The facility will offer spaces for use by community groups and citizens, including an innovation hub/maker space, a commercial kitchen, meeting rooms and a large multi-use space available for events, programming and farmers’ markets.

In addition, sustainable improvements will include installing LED lighting, air source heat pumps and energy recovery ventilators, more insulative windows and doors, increased roof insulation, on-demand electric water heaters and a building automation system. These enhancements are expected to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 29.5 tonnes per year and fuel consumption by 56.2 per cent.
