




Experience urban conveniences and natural beauty with some downtown shopping followed by a scenic trail run or ride.



- With 2 regional carriers and up to 5 direct flights to

 Edmonton and Calgary daily, Grande Prairie Airport

 offers one stop connections to the rest of the world.
- It's an easy drive from Grande Prairie to
 Edmonton—just 4 hours and 42 m inutes (457.6 km) via AB Highway 43 E. Or continue south from Edmonton along AB Highway 2S for another 2.5 hours to reach Calgary! Total drive is 752 km.
